Dr. Lyn Babb Schmid, 2014-2016 International President, posted an article in the current issue of **DKG NEWS**. Reflecting on Sarah Sladek's book, Knowing Y: Engage the Next Generation Now, she said that organizations are struggling to obtain/engage younger members, even though the Boomer and Veteran generations are still maintaining memberships.

She primarily looks at **redefining** "engagement", looking at hurdles to commitment, and the 3 Ms of **membership**. Organizations must evolve with the rest of the world. Sladek states that current membership engagement is the emotional commitment the member has to the mission/purposes of the organization. Commitment must be relationship based. To avoid distrust, transparency; hierarchy limitations, ignore length of time as a member; offline problems, get with the technology of today; deliver a level of return on their membership. Membership must be meaningful, motivational and memorable.
