Sad Days, Beautiful Memories

2016 has brought sad moments to our sisters as both Sharon Watkins and Sharon Rosales left this earth. We mourn their passing but celebrate the lives they lived.

Sharon Watkins shared excitement with family and friends upon being matched with a do-



nor to receive a new kidney to replace her cancerous one, the only one she had left. Within days she passed on due to complications from the transplant surgery. We will remember her engaging smile and her willingness to host a meeting at any given time. She was a guiding light to many Magnolia High School students during her

career and most recently served in the chaplain's office at Memorial Hermann-The Woodlands while also being accepted into their chaplaincy program for full certification. Sharon left us in February.

Sharon Rosales became ill, was admitted to the hospital, and from there was moved into ICU at St. Luke's, LufkIn, near the home she and Mario had made on the family property after both of them retired from Magnolia ISD. Heart complications, perhaps from an underlying problem, were beyond repair. Sharon began at Magnolia High School in 1986 to start the Texas Star Drill Team. With her leadership they won top awards even that first year and for many after that. At her funeral girls from many years of drill teams placed long

stemmed roses on her casket to honor her life. She left us in March.

We remember our Delta Kappa Gamma sisters and share the beautiful memories of their lives with each other.
